

MINUTES OF THE DRAINAGE AND FLOODING COMMITTEE OF THE CITY OF LA PORTE

The City of La Porte Drainage and Flooding Committee met on November 11, 2024, at the City Hall Council chamber, 604 West Fairmont Parkway, La Porte, Texas, at 5:00 p.m.

- 1. CALL TO ORDER Chair Martin called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m.

3. STATUTORY AGENDA

Member Engelken moved to approve the minutes of the October 14, 2024, meeting; the motion was seconded by Chair Martin; the motion was adopted, 2-0.

b. 100-Acre-Foot Pond - Presentation, discussion, and possible action regarding the status of the100-acre-foot detention pond project near the Pasadena Convention Center and Brookglen Subdivision, as established in amended interlocal agreement between the City of La Porte and the City of Pasadena. [Ray Mayo, Director of Public Works]

Mr. Mayo said the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers was expected to release the permit in mid-November and the 100% drawings would be issued in December.

c. HCFCD Project Update - Presentation, discussion, and possible action regarding Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) and Harris County Precinct 2 current and future plans related to Flooding in the City of La Porte. [Ray Mayo, Director of Public Works]

Mr. Mayo provided images of the work on the Brookglen Detention Basin on Gladwyne Lane. Chair Martin inquired about possible clearing on the property south of the Shady River subdivision. Mr. Mayo also showed images from the Northside Neighborhood Drainage Project. He added that progress at Bayside Terrace had been slowed last week due to weather. Jameson Appel said he believed completion would be closer to mid-April.
